The SCF had earlier bagged 'Best Sports NGO in India' award from the President of India in August last year. Adding to that, it also bagged 'India NGO Award' from Rockefeller Foundation, 'Best NGO Award' from America Cares India. Sai Baba also received 'Best Manager Award' from National Confederation of Resident Welfare Association in December 2015.

Asserting that the award is a big boost to the foundation, Sai Baba said that the corporate and government should come forward to help the initiative 'Built India Through Sports' to make a better society. "We are very happy for this recognition from the Jindal Steel and Power Ltd. We have been working for the betterment of less privileged children of the society through sports. This award is a

He also added that the SCF is training around 600 students at its premises out of which 500 are being trained without taking any fee. "We have been working for the last 24 years to promote sports in the weaker sections. We have worked

with around 30,000 children across the country through our 'Built India Through Sports' initiative. The Hyderabad district collector Rahul Bojja was impressed with our work and gave a project of promoting sports in 189 schools in the district. It is a great sign." He stressed that the corporates and government's support will transform the 'sleeping giant' India into a vibrant sporting nation.

The city-based multipurpose Sports Coaching Foundation (SCF) has won a rare recognition for an NGO that is dedicated exclusively to sports. It is one among four to be conferred the coveted 'India NGO Award' for the year. It is the only sports NGO in the latest roll of honours.

What makes this a very special one is that it has been instituted jointly by the New York-based Rockefeller Foundation, the London based Resource Alliance and the Mum-

bai-headquartered EdelGive Foundation, "said a beaming K. Sai Baba, the Foundation's founder-Secretary late Friday evening.

Stating that this would mark a major milestone in their history, he said that the recognition would instill a new zeal among all those associated with the Foundation whereby they would aim to further their spread and ensure that they reach as many youngsters as possible in the days ahead.

SCF, which completes its silver jubilee next year, has been in the forefront of promoting



the prevalence of a sports culture, particularly among youngsters belonging to the economically backward sec-

tion of the society.

"Although, we have been able to groom a good number of talents, the satisfaction was

more pronounced when three of our products, woman cricketer Archana das and footballers Simar Preet Singh and Mohd Tariq were picked for the national teams," pointed out Sai Baba, a former Ranji cricketer himself.

According to Sudden Deshmukh, the Foundation Administrator, the focus was on taking the Build India Through sports (BITS) to newer regions. Having accomplished substantial results in the two Telugu speaking States apart from Maharashtra and Karnataka,

they hope to enter other States. New Delhi, where a BITS pilot run received impressive response when the team received the award, has been quite encouraging he quipped.

In monetary terms the Rockefeller recognition may be nothing but the credibility of the honour would give a solid boost to the Foundation's resume, which, perhaps, may awaken the philanthropists to come forward with assistance in one form or the other. 

This Saibaba's miracle transforming sports enthusiasts

In a country where cricket is revered, Kammela Sai-baba, a former Andhra Ranji cricketer, has dedicated his life to nurturing young talent among underprivileged children. He believes that sports is the cheapest and most effective medicine available to society, and he has spent the last three decades proving it.

Saibaba, who played for the Andhra Ranji cricket team in 1989, initially followed the traditional path of securing a corporate job like many of his



contemporaries. However, a visit to Puttaparthi changed his perspective on life and society. He recalls an incident

that left a lasting impression on him. "A friend took me to Puttaparthi. Though I did not believe in Satya Sai Baba,

I went along. As I entered the Ashram, I left my slippers on the floor. A man picked them up, placed them in the rack, and greeted me with folded hands. Later, I was astonished to learn that he was the Chief Secretary of Orissa.

That moment made me rethink my purpose and my role in society." This new-found perspective led Saibaba to resign from his corporate job and establish the Sports Coaching Foundation (SCF) in 1991 at Masab Tank, Hyderabad.

His vision was clear: to prevent street children from falling into the traps of substance abuse and to give them a constructive outlet through sports.

Over the last 32 years, he has successfully trained thousands of children, not just in cricket but in various other sports, fostering a sporting culture that was previously absent in many government schools and orphanages.

Saibaba's commitment to sports development is evident in his work. His foundation has provided sports infrastructure to 380 schools across Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Mumbai, Nanded, and Delhi. His goal is to expand this reach to 1,000 schools, ensuring that every child, regardless of their economic background, gets the opportunity to engage in sports.

"Children in government schools often have no exposure to sports. Many of them cannot even differentiate between football and basketball. Sports is the cheapest medicine, and everyone should dedicate some time to physical activity," he asserts.

His contributions to social change through sports have earned him national recognition, including the prestigious President of India Award in 2015. Saibaba also cites UNESCO's declaration that sports and physical education are fundamental rights for all, reinforcing his belief in the transformative power of sports.

His journey serves as an inspiring testament to the power of sports in changing lives and communities.

Sports Coaching Foundation, founded by former Andhra Ranji cricketer K. Sai Baba in 1991 in Masab Tank here, has embarked on a challenging journey of providing basic amenities free of cost for students of Government schools, including sports material to dabble in some of the affordable disciplines like football, basketball and kho kho, with the biggest task being levelling the playfields.

This is an initiative which any government agency should have taken up long back. And, now SCF (a registered NGO), having covered 380 schools across the State, including some in Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh, is targeting 1,000 schools and 10 lakh school children.

"Yes, funding is a major hurdle with only Microsoft chipping in with some support. But, we are determined to reach the milestone," says 71-year-old Sai Baba, former Osmania University and Nizam College alumnus.

"The best part is that headmasters and principals of many of these schools where we have taken up this programme are happy with the increasing attendance of students. This is on record and they acknowledge it is because of the students' interest in sports. This is a major morale-booster for us," he said.

Collister distributed prizes to the young trainees at the SCF after having a close look at the coaching manual brought out by the



All pumped up!

SPORTS COACHING FOUNDATION IN MASAB TANK, THAT WAS STARTED 24 YEARS AGO RECEIVED RASHTRIYA KHEL PROTSAHAN PURASKAR FROM THE PRESIDENT

Twenty four years ago, a small marshy ground at Masab Tank was a desolate place without any activity. Things changed for good in 1991 when former cricketer K Sai Baba entered into an agreement with GHMC for promotion of sports in public-private partnership. Thus was born the Sports Coaching Foundation(SCF).

"I am grateful to Jannat Hussain for reposing faith in me," says Baba. Today, SCF boasts of 600 children, a majority of them from slums, who play basketball, cricket, volleyball, boxing, karate, tennis and football on this one-acre land. Recognising his contribution to sports and encouraging street children, SCF was nominated for the Rashtriya Khel Protshan Puraskar,

the highest award given to a non-governmental organisation for promoting sports.

"It is one of the most memorable days of my life. My hard work has been recognised. I dedicate this award to these children," says Baba, who received the award from President Pranab Mukherjee at Rashtrapathi Bhavan in New Delhi along with Arjuna, Dhyana Chand and Dronacharya awardees in August.

Talking about his foundation, the 60-year-old says, "I always thought these children did not have the required finances or parents' encouragement to enjoy these games. But they had the desire to play. Keeping this in mind, I encouraged these children. Initially, these children had a lot of reservations. I had to coax

and convince them to take up sports. Today, I am happy that there are many orphans who are active at the foundation. They forget their suffering by indulging in sports. That is the biggest victory and satisfaction for me as I am

able to bring joy to these orphans and street children," beams Baba.

Today, SCF bustles with activity. "We started with two disciplines and with our limited resources, we extended our activities to as many as seven disciplines. We also built flood lights to play at night. We have certain hours in the day reserved for under-privileged children. We also came up with a project called Build India Through Sports (BITS) that has helped provide opportunities to about 25,000 children," he shares with pride and satisfaction.

Baba's idea is to spread awareness about the value of sports. "It is important that children, rich or poor, should play sports. I would like these under-privileged children to play games for they will be busy and distance themselves from crime and illegal activities. I have been successful to some extent but there is still a lot of work to do. There could be more hidden talent among these slum children too," feels Baba who has also visited several government-run schools, in the city and adjoining districts, promoting sports. "I want to create more awareness among the younger generation about the importance of participating in sports. I believe that sports and education go simultaneously. Sports can build a child's character. It imparts discipline in them," he says.

SCF being a non-profit organisation, Baba has gone through the hard way. "However, I am lucky as I get general donations that help me run the show. It is a challenge and this new award motivates me to strive harder in promoting sports, particularly among street children," he shares.

Finding talent in the slums

MFor the past 24 years, K. Sai Baba has been encouraging the underprivileged to take up sports. His brainchild, Sports Coaching Foundation in the city, received the prestigious Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puraskar on August 29, for its contribution to the development of sports. When the government approached him to start an NGO to promote sports back in 1991, he grabbed the opportunity, quit his lucrative job at a bank and dedicated all his time to make sports accessible to the underprivileged.

"We were the first to install a bowling machine in India, which we had imported from New York in 1994. We were the first to have flood lights and speed guns too. In the beginning, whatever donations we received, we used that to build infrastructure. We thought this would attract people, and the amount they paid could be used to run the NGO. That's how we survived for 24 years," says Sai Baba, who also received the India NGO Award 2015 for its flagship project, Build India Through Sports (BITS).

"BITS project was started 15 years back and we have so far taught over 16,000 kids. As part of this, we approach government schools, orphanages etc. to promote sports. We also develop infrastructure - bas-

courts etc. at these schools. Not only in Hyderabad, I also approached schools across Telangana, Maharashtra, Karnataka and recently, Delhi," says Sai Baba.

He adds, "We need to change the mindset of the country. Parents only want their kids to score good marks and often hesitate to let them take up a sport. Also, they think taking up sports is a big risk where a single injury can end your stint. There are also a few examples of sports stars like the eight-time national boxing champion Dennis Swamy, who never got his due and is struggling to make ends meet, which could also be a reason why they hesitate. Though I must admit that the current government is promoting sports on a big scale."

He adds that back then, many working professionals and actors were attracted to the ground because of its infrastructure, including Rana Daggubati and Allu Arjun. "Now, a lot of commercial grounds have come up and people are opting for those. To

survive, I approached foreign students, who now come here often to play. They only contribute around ₹50 per person but no amount is too little for us," he says.

Archana Das, a women's cricket player and Sameer Preet and Mohammed Tariq, football players, are products of SCF who have represented the country. The institution also conducts inter-slum tournaments where both underprivileged and privileged kids are allowed to participate. He adds, "Slums are where you find a lot of talent — they have the determination to win. They just need someone who can guide them in the right path and they can win medals for the country."

Sai Baba concludes, "We want to transform over 5 lakh children and want to reach every corner of India. For this, we will need partners who are ready to donate to help us achieve our goal of making India a sports hub." He adds, "I am lucky to have my wife K. Srivalli by my side. She and my son Sunil Naidu

In altruistic, sporting sprit

Sports Coaching Foundation is reaching out to promote sporting activity in Government schools

Sports Coaching Foundation (at Masab Tank, Hyderabad) has embarked on an innovative project 'Build India Through Sports' which aims at not only spreading awareness about sports in select Government Schools but also ensure that a sports-friendly ambience is created on the premises with the hope of a continuity for sports activity.

"We initially hold discussions with the School management involving the Physical Education Teacher which is almost like a seminar and try to explain the importance of having sporting activity on their premises which should also result in better academic results. Recreation should be part of any curriculum," feels K. Sai Baba, general secretary of the SCF which has already reached out to 50 such schools where some of the students who have never seen any sports equipment of quality are already getting a feel of what it is.

The second step, depending on the response of the schools, involves a visit by the coaching faculty armed with the basic sports equipment to give some sort of demo out on the sports arenas to lure students into sporting activity. "Mind you, this is not a commercial venture but purely funded by the NGO which is a non-profit organisation supported by crucial wings of the State government including the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation since 1991," remembers Sai, a former Andhra Ranji cricketer and also Executive Committee member of the Hyderabad Cricket Association.

The project involves educating the children about the stupendous sporting achievements like five-time World women's boxing champion Mary Kom, especially among

the exclusive girls schools to provide the right dose of inspiration. "Yes, it is a fact that some of them don't even have a level playing field, leave alone play facilities. That is exactly why we are trying to reach out by installing make-shift basketball rings, levelling whatever play area is available. We have provided dozens of footballs and basketballs to many schools and are ready to see that there is some activity," explains the SCF general secretary.

What is the reason for this project to take off? "From my own experience, it is the Government schools which lack the desired impetus and support. So, I thought let us start from there to cater to the lower strata of the society," he replies.

The whole project is being pursued with sheer passion within the SCF's limited financial resources and without any corpus fund for the same, he insists, adding, "We will be more than happy if there is sporting activity throughout the year; the SCF is always there to help any school in this regard."

In a way it is a concept which uses sports as a tool to

facilitate personality development and develop human values, with the help of the success stories of champions like Sania Mirza, Saina Nehwal are explained to the children. Also, school students have a platform by way of free entry to events which the SCF conducts to showcase their skills and dream big.


Sai Baba points out that the response was really good in some schools like Sabdarai Girls High School (Mehdipatnam) which has 1200 students and the Errum Manzil Government High School. "It gives us immense pleasure that now many Government Schools are making use of the equipment we donated and also the basic infrastructure like creating volleyball, basketball, kho kho and kabaddi courts too," he says.

Interestingly, many of the Government School students too get a feel of the bowling machine of the SCF, incidentally the first organization in India to get this way back in early 90s, digital speed gun. "We hope to contribute in our own small way for the promotion of sports. This is an ongoing project," signs off the SCF official.

Sporting values

When former state level cricketer Sai Baba set up the Sports Coaching Foundation (SCF) 15 years ago, all he had was limited resources, a neighborhood of trouble making *gundas* and three students. His dedication for the cause and support from the government has now resulted in a professional sports academy with 12 cricket nets, a 300-seater pavilion, well equipped gym and sports library.

"We offer free coaching to underprivileged boys and girls and charge nominally from those who can afford," says Sai Baba. "Corporates like the GVK group and Mercedes Benz have come forward to support us," he adds. SCF has tied up with several NGOs working with children in the city to identify kids who might have a potential for excelling in sports. Children are

cricket, tennis, football, gymnastics or hockey. "Along with training in sports, we try to refine the individual's values to make him/her a positive thinker," says Sai Baba. A case in point is the recent enrollment of about 225 tribal children for training in cricket.

Efforts are on to make the academy available to students all around the year and 24 hours a day. A part of the Academy is now being converted into an indoor pavilion, to facilitate day and night playing as well. An audio-visual room with projection facilities is used to demonstrate gaming techniques and lessons, with the help of international DVDs that the academy has collected over the years. "Being a sportsman I wanted to spread a sporting culture in the city and working with children has always



About the Indian attitude towards sports.

Sai Baba, the founder of Sports Coaching Foundation says, "China has 3000 sports schools, India doesn't even have 30 all over the country. Mass participation always brings out the best of talent anywhere."

Most speakers however reflected on the practicality of the situation pointing out that even the 30 sports schools that are present in India are on the verge of losses. Sachdev IRS, Commissioner of Income Tax points out, "Without the right sports culture a number of sports schools also would be a waste. One would not pursue a sports dream just out of passion. Professional education ultimately plays a role in building a career here in India. I believe sportspersons must be promised a job or an income. Only then will we find effective participation."

Other perspectives also threw light on the inefficiency of the GO that was passed regarding the compulsory inclusion of sports in the curriculum. The GO still remains to be only a text on paper as schools in the State provide makeshift playgrounds to obtain recognition. Sai Baba expresses his anguish as he says, "There are over 750 playgrounds in Hyderabad alone. 500 are not even in use. Schools which do not have a playground can use those playgrounds on shifts system. Where there is a will there is a way. But our society's attitude towards sports isn't letting sport culture grow."

City's sports coaching body tops

Hyderabad-based Sports Coaching Foundation has been nominated among the top three sports NGOs in the world at the Peace and Sport Forum's 9th international summit in Monte Carlo, Monaco. An elated SCF founder and president K. Saibaba received the nomination at the conference.

This is the first international recognition for SCF, which had won the prestigious Rashtriya Khel Protashan Puraskar at the Government of India sports awards last year besides five other national level awards.
